Fiji Preschools Development Project

We believe that an achievable way to reduce poverty and achieve sustainable development is through providing quality early learning education for preschool children in order to create a foundation for ongoing learning, which will assist in eventual employment. This is the emphasis and basis for our preschool program in Fiji.

Bethel Crusade Preschools began in Suva in 1994 with nine children. Since then approximately 3000 children have been through and graduated from our preschools. Bethel Crusade Preschools has expanded to reach a total of eight preschools located throughout Fiji in Suva, Savusavu, Labasa, Lakena (Nasouri), Sigatoka, Daku, Nacavanadi and Koro Island.

The number of children enrolling in the preschools has continually increased over the years with several currently sitting at their maximum intake.

In each of our preschools children wear uniforms, have set lessons and learning times, and have the opportunity to play. At the end of each year there is a graduation ceremony for the children who are leaving to attend primary school and continue with their education.

Our curriculum and ethos has lifted the standard of preschool education within the communities we work in. Local families, communities, and government agencies see them as being providers of high quality, top calibre preschool education. Primary schools have stated that students who have attended a Bethel Crusade Preschool are significantly advanced in comparison to other children when they begin school.

Over the next three years we are embarking on a new project to improve Bethel Crusade Preschools for students, teachers and the local communities they are involved in and connected to.

The major objective of the new project is:

To have eight fully functioning preschools complete with facilities that meet government and OHS standards, trained and certified teachers, and sewing courses to empower mothers and other women in the preschool communities.

This project has three main goals through which the major outcome will be achieved.

Goal one is to establish and maintain preschool facilities that meet government and OHS standards. The outcome of this goal will be to have fully functioning sanitary toilet facilities and safe playgrounds in every preschool by the end of 2020.

Goal two is to improve quality of education and management of the preschools through enhancing teacher capacity. The outcome of this goal will be to have preschool teachers that are professionally equipped to run preschools and deliver quality education.

Goal three is to provide sewing courses to empower mothers and other women in preschool communities to better provide for their families. The outcome of this goal will be to have women who are equipped with skills that enhance employability and improve the livelihoods of target communities.

We have been able to maintain tax deductible benefits for this new three year Fiji Preschools Development Project through Global Development Group. Further information about tax deductibility can be found on pages 26 and 27 of this booklet.



Goal One

The first goal of the Fiji Preschools Development Project is:

To establish and maintain preschool facilities that meet government and OHS standards.

The outcome of this goal will be:

To have fully functioning sanitary toilet facilities and safe playgrounds in every preschool by the end of 2020.

When measuring the present playground and bathroom conditions of our eight preschools to the desired results, there is a lot of work to do.

Four of our eight preschools have some form of playground equipment, however, all of these require maintenance and expansion work. In addition to this, all of

these playgrounds, except for one, are not currently fenced. Throughout this project these playgrounds will need to be fenced in addition to the maintenance and expansion work.

The remaining four preschools do not have any playground or any fencing. For these preschools we will need to construct brand new playgrounds to cater for the varying number of children enrolled in each. All of these playgrounds will also need to be fenced.

When it comes to bathroom facilities, all of our preschools have significant needs. These needs will need to be met in order to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards that have been set out by the Ministry of Education in Fiji.

Throughout this project we are looking at installing at least two sanitary child-

friendly flush toilets within each preschool. We will need to have at least one toilet for boys and one for girls. We also need to install at least one sanitary flush toilet for our staff and teachers to use. In addition to the toilets, we would like to ensure each of our preschools has two child-friendly hand washing basins.

In comparison to our other two goals for this project, this first goal will require the most construction and hands-on work. This means that we will need to source an adequate amount of personnel who are able to assist in meeting the various targets within this goal.

This may be done in two ways. Firstly, we would like to send teams of people to Fiji to assist in the construction and upgrading of the various playground and bathroom facilities. This not only contributes to achieving the set targets within this goal, it also enables those

that offer financial and other means of support to become involved in the hands-on work and experience the project firsthand.

Secondly, above all else we would like to encourage parents and additional men and women within our preschool communities to become involved in the project. They will have the opportunity to assist in the construction and upgrading of playgrounds, fences and bathroom facilities. Encouraging involvement within the community will ensure that local participation becomes a key feature of the project.

Individual profiles of our eight preschools and their various needs surrounding playground and bathroom facilities are included throughout the following pages. By the end of this project we hope that most, if not all, of the following needs will be met within each of our preschools.



Sigatoka

Bethel Crusade Preschool Sigatoka began in 2009. In 2018 the preschool has a total enrolment of 35 children.

The current playground equipment and bathroom facilities within Sigatoka are adequate but do have room for improvement.

The playground is in good condition but needs some general maintenance and will need to be expanded to cater for the number of children in the preschool.

Our preschool teachers and staff have found that children argue over the equipment as there are too many children for the size of the playground.

In addition to this, we need to fence the playground to meet the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards.

A fence will clearly set out a designated play area for the children, enable teachers and staff to supervise the children with greater ease, and provide clear entry and exit points so the children do not run around the preschool property aimlessly among other benefits.

One issue faced by the preschool in Sigatoka is animals entering into the children's playspace. Fencing the area will protect children from animals that may roam around the preschool property.

Parents and other members of the preschool community will assist with the upgrading of the playground and the construction of the fence.

In terms of the bathroom facilities, the existing facilities are in good condition. However, an additional two toilets may need to be added to cater for the number of children enrolled.

The main issue the preschool in Sigatoka faces is flooding. When faced with heavy rain the preschool property floods which stops children from coming to preschool and creates hazardous conditions for those on the property.

In order to create safer conditions for children when it is raining, the bathroom facility needs to be properly cemented. Currently the front of the bathroom block gets very muddy when it rains and poses a hazard for the children.

In addition to this, the walkway to the toilet is not wide enough and is not covered. When it rains children do not have any cover from the rain on their way to the bathroom.

Throughout this three year project it would be good to widen the path and build a cover for the walkway to create a safer environment for the children.

Where is Sigatoka?



Overview of Sigatoka's needs:

- Expand the existing playground to better cater for number of children enrolled
- Fence the entire playground to comply with OHS standards
- Expand the existing bathroom to better cater for number of children enrolled
- Create a safe walkway to the bathroom



Daku

Bethel Crusade Preschool Daku began in 2004. In 2018 there are a total of 15 children enrolled in the preschool.

The preschool currently has a playground which consists of a set of swings and some tyres for the children to play on. However, these facilities have a lot of room for improvement.

We would like to construct a new playground in Daku that will consist of a slide, a new set of swings, a sandpit, and more equipment if possible.

The new playground will be built on a different section of the preschool property to where the current playground is located.

In order to keep the children safe during their outdoor play time, we will need to

fence the entire playground to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards.

As can be seen in the above pictures, various farm animals roam freely around the preschool property. Fencing the playground will protect children from these animals located in close proximity to the preschool.

In regards to the bathroom facilities, they currently have two toilets; one for girls and one for boys. However, the toilet for girls is not working at the moment. We may need to add an additional two toilets to the preschool.

In addition to repairing the girls' toilet and adding more toilets, piping from the water tank to the bathroom facilities needs some improvement. The water tank will need to be directly linked to the toilets, shower and hand washing basin to enable

flushing toilets and a direct flow of water from the water tank.

In order to increase safety for the children when using the bathroom, a cement path will need to be built from the entrance of the preschool to the entrance of the toilet block. This will ensure children do not have to walk through the mud when it is raining.

Overall the preschool facilities within the Daku preschool need a significant amount of work. This also includes the preschool building. During this project we would like to dedicate additional time and effort to upgrading the current preschool facility so it is safer for the staff and children.

Parents and other adults within the preschool community will be included in the maintenance and construction work that will be undertaken within the preschool throughout this project.

Where is Daku?



Overview of Daku's needs:

- Construct a new and improved playground
- Fence the entire playground to comply with OHS standards
- Upgrade bathroom facilities and install pipes from the water tank to bathroom
- Create a safe walkway to the bathroom



Labasa

Bethel Crusade Preschool Labasa began in 2008. In 2018 there are a total of 24 children enrolled in the preschool.

Our preschool in Labasa already has a playground, however, it will need to be upgraded and new equipment will need to be constructed to better meet the needs of the preschool.

The number of children enrolled in the preschool exceeds the number of children that can comfortably use the current playground equipment all at the one time. This means that more equipment will need to be added to cater for the number of children enrolled in the preschool.

We would like to invest in a new set of swings and a slide. We would also like to build a sandpit for the children to play in.

New play equipment will be constructed in the same location as the present playground as this area offers the greatest amount of shade for the children.

As with the other preschools, we will need to fence the entire playground in order to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards.

Fencing the playground will ensure the children remain safe as they play and that no animals located around the property will be able to enter into the play area. Among other benefits, due to the preschool being located on a big property, fencing the playground will ensure the children do not roam around freely but are instead constricted to a safe and supervised area.

In terms of the bathroom facilities, the preschool in Labasa currently has two toilets; one for the boys and one for the

girls. Throughout this project we would like to upgrade the existing toilets and add two more toilets to better cater for the number of children enrolled in the preschool.

The current toilet facilities are located in a sheltered area attached to the preschool building. This means that children can access the bathroom safely and easily.

When Labasa experiences heavy rain the area around the preschool gets very muddy. We will need to build a cement walkway from the carpark area to the preschool to ensure children are safer when walking downhill.

We would also like to build a cement walkway from the entrance of the preschool to the back of the preschool where the toilets are located just in case anyone chooses to access the toilets this way.

Where is Labasa?



Overview of Labasa's needs:

- Expand the existing playground to better cater for number of children enrolled
- Fence the entire playground to comply with OHS standards
- Expand the existing bathroom to better cater for number of children enrolled
- Create a safe walkway to the preschool



Nacavanadi

Bethel Crusade Preschool Nacavanadi began in 2011. In 2018 the preschool has a total enrolment of 19 children.

There is currently no adequate playground within the Nacavanadi preschool. We will need to construct a new playground for the children. This new play area will need to be able to cater for the growing number of children enrolling in the Nacavanadi preschool.

There is currently a platform with a slide attached, however, the platform is not safe and will need to be rebuilt. The preschool also has a second slide but it is not attached to anything. Both slides are in very good condition.

We would like to construct a new platform that can hold two slides for the children to

play on. In addition to this, we would also like to invest in building a sandpit and two sets of swings in a shaded area that will offer protection from the sun for the children.

Unlike our other preschools, the preschool in Nacavanadi is already fenced. The fence is adequate for now but will need to be strengthened at some point during the project.

Rather than creating a new fence to surround the future playground, we will just build the playground within the existing fence that surrounds the preschool property.

The current bathroom facilities are not sufficient for the number of children enrolled. The preschool currently has one toilet and one shower. There is no hand washing basin so the children use two bowls to wash their hands.

We will need to extend the current bathroom facility so that we can build an additional three toilets within the preschool.

In order to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards, we need to build enough toilets to cater for the number of children enrolled in the preschool.

In addition to constructing additional toilets, we would also like to construct a proper hand washing basin. This will increase the overall level of personal hygiene within the preschool.

Due to this preschool being located within a village, local participation is encouraged. Parents and other members of the village will assist in the building of the playground, the strengthening of the fence and any work to do with upgrading the bathroom facilities.

Where is Nacavanadi?



Overview of Nacavanadi's needs:

- Reconstruct slide platform to hold two slides
- Construct new playground equipment where needed
- Strengthen the existing fence to comply with OHS standards
- Expand existing bathroom facility



Savusavu

Buca Bethel Crusade Preschool in Savusavu began in 1998. In 2018 the preschool has a total enrolment of 43 children.

There is no playground in Savusavu at the moment so there is a lot of work that needs to be done.

The total enrolment of children is rather large which means a bigger playground will need to be constructed compared to most of our other preschools.

Building a bigger playground from the beginning will decrease the number of arguments that may arise amongst a large number of children using the same play equipment at the one time.

We would like to invest in constructing a

good covered sandpit under a shaded area of the property. We would also like to build a platform for two slides and construct a couple sets of swings in addition to other playground equipment.

In addition to this work, we will need to fence the whole playground in order to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards.

The area where the playground will be built is safe and secure. The fence will enhance this security and will prevent the children from running freely around the property into any potential danger.

Among other benefits, fencing the playground will also enable the staff and teachers to supervise the children with greater ease if they are all in the same area.

In regards to the bathroom, the current

facilities within the preschool in Savusavu are insufficient. The preschool only has one toilet and there is no adequate hand washing basin for the children to wash their hands properly.

Throughout this project we will need to build a new toilet block with four to six toilets to cater towards the large number of children enrolled.

In addition to this, we will also need to construct a proper hand washing basin and possibly two showers; one for the boys and one for the girls. All of these improvements are necessary in order to meet the OHS standards.

It is our aim to have as many parents and members of the preschool community assisting in all of this work as possible. Including parents and other members of the community in the work ensures local participation within the project.

Where is Savusavu?



Overview of Savusavu's needs:

- Construct a new playground that will cater for the number of children enrolled
- Fence the entire playground to comply with OHS standards
- Construct a new bathroom facility that will cater for the number of children enrolled



Lakena

Bethel Crusade Preschool Lakena began in 2007. In 2018 the preschool has a total enrolment of 35 children.

The preschool does not have any playground on the property at the moment and the overall preschool needs a significant amount of work.

When it rains for more than two or three hours the whole preschool floods. We need to level the property so severe flooding does not continue to occur. We also need to upgrade the overall facility to repair existing damage.

After leveling the property we would like to build a temporary playground at the back of the property. This playground will need to cater for the number of children enrolled. It would be good to install some

slides, sets of swings and a sandpit. Additional playground equipment will be built where desired.

After the ground is tough and everything is level, perhaps after a year or so, we are looking at relocating the preschool building to the back of the property. We will then move the playground equipment to the front of the property to build a permanent playground.

Both the temporary and permanent playgrounds will need to be fenced to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards. This will increase the safety of the play area for all children.

In terms of the bathroom, the current facilities are not adequate. The preschool only has one toilet and does not have any hand washing basin.

Throughout this project we will need to

build a new toilet block with four to six toilets to better cater for the number of children enrolled in the preschool.

We would like these toilets to be smaller than the traditional adult toilet. This will ensure children are able to use the bathroom facilities with greater ease.

We also need to install a proper hand washing basin so children can wash their hands after using the toilets. We may also install one or two showers.

All of these improvements and upgrades are necessary in order to meet the OHS standards for preschools in Fiji.

All of this work to the preschool in Lakena will take a significant amount of time and effort. The goal is for parents and members of the Lakena community to assist in all of the leveling and construction work throughout the project.

Where is Lakena?



Overview of Lakena's needs:

- Level out the property and build a temporary fenced playground
- Relocate playground to the front of the property after leveling work is complete
- Construct a new bathroom facility that will cater for the number of children enrolled



Suva

Bethel Crusade Preschool Suva began in 1994. In 2018 the preschool has a total enrolment of 73 children. This is the largest preschool and the main base of Bethel Crusade Preschools in Fiji.

The preschool facility in Suva is of a high standard. The building was recently built and has been a great asset to Bethel Crusade Preschools.

Whilst the inside of the preschool facility is sufficient, the outdoor area needs some work.

There is currently no playground at the preschool. We are looking at building a large playground to cater for the number of children enrolled.

We would like this playground to consist

of slides, sets of swings and a sandpit. Additional play equipment will be built where desired.

Having a playground will provide the children with an opportunity for outdoor play which they do not currently have the chance to enjoy.

The playground will need to be fenced to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards.

This fence will enhance the safety of the children whilst they enjoy their play. Amongst other benefits, it will also enable staff and teachers to supervise the large amount of children with greater ease as they are all restricted to the one outdoor location.

In regards to the bathroom facilities, the current bathroom is the best out of our eight preschools simply because the

overall preschool facility is new. However, there are some minor additions that need to be made.

One of the toilets in our Suva preschool has been designed to be a disabled toilet. At the moment there is no railing so it cannot yet be classified as a disabled toilet.

Throughout this project we are looking at installing railing that will begin on one side of the disabled toilet and will carry on into the shower. This means that the shower will also become a disabled accessible shower.

In order to complete all of the work on the playground and bathroom, we will need the assistance of parents and other members of the preschool community. Having the assistance of these people will ensure local participation within the project.

Where is Suva?



Overview of Suva's needs:

- Construct a new playground that will cater for the number of children enrolled
- Fence the entire playground to comply with OHS standards
- Complete the railing inside the disabled toilet and shower area



Koro Island

In 2016 Fiji was hit by a devastating cyclone - Cyclone Winston. Following this cyclone Koro Island reached out to Bethel Crusade Preschools for assistance.

Koro Island's call for help resulted in a team of people traveling to the island to begin construction on a new preschool facility. Upon arrival this group of people began building the facility and within 15 days a preschool was built.

This preschool on Koro Island is the most recent addition to Bethel Crusade Preschools. In 2018 there is a total enrolment of 25 children.

There is currently no playground at the preschool. We are looking to install a new playground on Koro Island so the children have greater opportunities when it comes

to outdoor play. We would like this playground to consist of slides, sets of swings, a sandpit and more play equipment if it is possible.

The playground facility will be built with the number of children enrolled in mind to ensure that there is enough equipment for the number of children that will be using it.

The whole playground area will need to be fenced to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards. This fence will create a safer environment for the children as they play.

Among other benefits, fencing the playground will also stop children from running freely around the preschool property away from the supervision of staff and teachers.

In terms of the bathroom facilities, the preschool currently has two toilets within

the building. The standard of these toilets is adequate, however, the overall bathroom facility will need some work.

We would like to install an additional two toilets so there are two for the boys and two for the girls.

Installing additional toilets will ensure the preschool on Koro Island is able to cater for the number of children enrolled. It will also mean that the preschool is better prepared for a larger intake of children in the future.

Similar to our other preschools, parents and other men and women within the preschool community will assist in the construction of the playground and fence, as well as the expansion of the bathroom facilities. It is important to incorporate local participation into the project. We may also be able to send teams of people to Fiji to assist in the construction work.

Where is Koro Island?



Overview of Koro Island's needs:

- Construct a new playground that will cater for the number of children enrolled in the preschool
- Fence the entire playground to comply with OHS standards
- Expand existing bathroom facility



Goal Two

The second goal of the Fiji Preschools Development Project is:

To improve quality of education and management of the preschools through enhancing teacher capacity.

The outcome of this goal will be:

To have preschool teachers that are professionally equipped to run preschools and deliver quality education.

As mentioned at the beginning of this booklet, one of the most effective ways to empower children in Fiji to reach their full potential in life is through education.

Receiving an education not only impacts the life of the individual but it paves the way for future generations to avoid the poverty trap through attending school and

completing eventual tertiary qualifications. The benefits and possibilities available through access to quality education are endless.

In order to lift the standard of education within our preschools we need certified teachers that are well equipped to teach the children. This is the basis for the second goal within this project.

We are currently developing a high quality teacher training course at an accredited level. This course will run at a minimal charge each year for those wishing to become teachers within our preschools.

In the first year of the course we will upskill our existing preschool teachers and offer it to our unaccredited staff. The purpose of upskilling our existing teachers is to ensure that everyone involved in our preschools is fully equipped to deliver a high standard of preschool education.

Our teachers will not only be trained to deliver a higher quality of education, our teachers will also become more enhanced in preschool management. This will ensure that our preschools continue to be run at a professional standard.

In addition to running an accredited training course, the second goal of this project also includes running annual teacher training workshops.

These annual workshops for our preschool teachers have been provided for a number of years now. They have been very beneficial and provide preschool teacher training in curriculum planning, craft ideas and other areas. They also include First Aid and CPR training.

The contributions by proficient and knowledgeable workshop facilitators have significantly raised the level of our teachers' intellect and familiarity in the

line of preschool teaching. The teachers have a good grasp on what the Fijian Government requires from every preschool in Fiji and understand how to apply government curriculum.

We are looking into opening the teacher training course and workshops up to teachers outside Bethel Crusade Preschools. We not only want to strengthen the standard of education and management within our own preschools, but also within surrounding preschools. Enhancing the capacity of preschool teachers throughout Fiji greatly benefits all preschool children, not just those who attend Bethel Crusade Preschools.

We have opened the annual teacher training workshop up in the past and we received positive feedback from those in attendance. This has encouraged us to continue reaching out to those outside Bethel Crusade Preschools.



Goal Three

The third and final goal of the Fiji Preschools Development Project is:

To provide sewing courses to empower mothers and other women in preschool communities to better provide for their families.

The outcome of this goal will be:

To have women who are equipped with skills that enhance employability and improve the livelihoods of target communities.

Women in Fiji are more vulnerable to poverty due to their limited involvement in formal employment, increasing rates of divorce and separation, and associated problems of collecting maintenance and support payments. Women's lack of inheritance rights to land and other major

assets also constrains their access to credit.

With the recognition that women in Fiji are most vulnerable to poverty for various reasons, this project incorporates sewing classes for women within the preschool communities as a means of empowerment.

Providing sewing classes equips mothers and other women with new skills. These new skills empower women by creating the opportunity to gain potential future employment and/or a source of income which enables them to better provide for their families.

Our target throughout this third goal is to commence annual sewing courses within each of our preschools. This may look different for each preschool depending on demand and facilities available, however, we want to start some form of sewing

course within each preschool.

Prior to the Fiji Preschools Development Project commencing, sewing courses had already begun in Suva.

Our preschool staff and teachers have noticed that many parents, especially mothers, sit around outside the preschool all morning waiting for their children to finish. This has created a great opportunity to provide something beneficial for these women to do during the time that preschool is running. This is how the idea for sewing courses commenced.

Previous courses that have run have received very positive feedback from women involved. Many of these women have raised their own ideas on what they can create throughout the course and have even managed to create multiple items for their families.

The great positive response and results from previous sewing courses encourages us to invest time and effort into translating this success across the remaining preschools.

The situation in Suva is very similar to our other preschools. Many mothers and other women spend their mornings sitting around outside the preschools waiting for their children to finish for the day.

We are planning to send teams to Fiji to train local women in overseeing and facilitating sewing courses. When we have trained people in-country they can travel around to other preschools and train more ladies to run the sewing courses.

We are very excited to see the opportunities that may arise for our preschool mothers and other women within the communities. We are also excited to see the positive impact of these courses on whole families.
