60 YEARS OF CRUSADE HALL



HISTORY OF CRUSADE HALL

Adelaide Christian Centre is located in the original land grant of Adelaide Town Acre 559, which was granted to Osmond Gilles. Osmond Gilles was born on the 24th of August 1788 in England. He arrived on the Buffalo in 1836 to be South Australia's first Colonial Treasurer. He was one of the early officials of the colony.

A colourful and volatile man, he was wealthy in his own right and generous in many ways, giving land for churches, hospitals and other public use, and using his own funds when the colony's own ran short. Osmond died on the 25th of September 1866 at Glen Osmond.

The Original Hall (now referred to as Crusade Hall) on the corner of Myers Lane

had multiple owners prior to Adelaide Christian Centre becoming the owner. Previous owners can be found below.

Adelaide C.R.C. Assembly buys a City Building . . .

... CRUSADE'S BOLD MOVE TO PURCHASE FINE NEW CENTRE!

PROVIDENTIALLY, just as the Adelaide C.R.C. assembly was about to lay foundations for a new hall in the grounds of "Sunrise House," Fullarton, which would have catered only for weeknight activities, a very suitable city building became available by auction.

Incidentally, we also received news that Legacy House, where we have gathered every Sunday for many years, was soon to be sold.

The building previously known as "Kingdom Hall," at 33 Sturt St., just one block from Legacy House, was to be auctioned on September 30. The Pastors, Elders and Business Council were unanimous in their conviction that this was God's provision of a centre for all our activities—on Sundays and throughout the week. We decided we would not bid higher than £16,500, although at the time we had only £2,000 available, with £3,000 offered in interest-free loans!

The hall was eventually secured by the C.R.C. for £15,600.

At the time of writing (10/10/58) we still need another £2,000 in loans or gifts before the end of October when the purchase has to be finalised, but we know God will see this matter through. Then we shall need another £2,000 for minor alterations and furniture.

This new centre has a splendid auditorium seating 500, and numerous other rooms front and back. It is situated only four blocks south of the G.P.O., and in an area of the city that is rapidly developing and where values are rising. It is a type of building that can be easily resold if that should for any reason be desirable.

We expect to move all our activities into this new hall in the near future, as soon as alterations

and furnishings are completed. We believe this place will become the centre of real Bible revival throughout Adelaide and further afield.

If you believe in the move we have undertaken — the biggest and boldest we have ever undertaken in faith — then will you pray about this matter and ask God what He would have you do to help us meet this terrific challenge?

The Adelaide Business Council will be pleased to accept gifts or interest-fee loans, large or small, for long or short terms. It will undertake to repay loans on short notice.

We shall report further developments in next month's "Revivalist."

Meanwhile we covet your prayers for God's blessing upon the preparation of this new centre for a full-scale programme of revival ministry right in the city of Adelaide.

Adelaide Assembly's New Hall

In our last issue of "The Revivalist" we announced the decision of the Adelaide C.R.C. to purchase a new property at 33 Sturt Street, City. At that time we were in need of £15,600 for the purchase, besides almost £2,000 for furnishing and alteration.

We are delighted to report now that this money has been provided in the form of gifts and loans—a really amazing response, and certain evidence of God's Seal on this new project. We shall value the continued support of our many friends to enable

us to repay loans and clear the debt on the Lord's house.

Although the official opening of this new centre must await the completion of minor alterations in the building, we moved our week-night activities into the hall on Tuesday, 4th November, when a splendid gathering attended and four people received the Holy Spirit with signs following.

Faith and expectancy are at high tide in the Adelaide Assembly, with many souls coming to Christ and many others testifying to miraculous healing by God's power.

Official Opening of New CRUSADE HALL, ADELAIDE

The official opening of the Adelaide Assembly's new Crusade Hall at 33 Sturt Street, City, was held Saturday, 6th June, at 7.30 p.m. To mark the occasion, pastors and people from other Full Gospel Churches in Adelaide were invited to participate in a service of thanksgiving and dedication.

Since this property was purchased in October last year, much work has been involved in altering and renovating the building to make accommodation available for the large Sunday night gather-

ings of the C.R.C.

Already week-night meetings have been held in the Crusade Hall for some months and the baptistry has been used, but the first Sunday services were conducted there on 7th June at 3 p.m. and 7 p.m., followed by a Bible deliverance campaign by American evangelist, Herman Walters, commencing Tuesday, 9th June. New "Crusade Hall" Opened in Adelaide

The week-end of June 6th-7th will be long remembered in Adelaide as the first week-end in the new Crusade Hall, Sturt Street, City (see picture on front cover).

On Saturday evening 6th, the official opening took place with about 350 people attending. Expressions of thanksgiving to God and to all who gave and worked to assist in purchasing and preparing this new centre were made by Brother D. J. Barrett (Secretary) and Pastors Alan Bonython and Ken Chant.

"Revival in a Dance Hall"

Brother Barrett pointed out that the outstanding feature of the witness brought to Adelaide by Pastor Leo Harris was that God could give revival and signs and wonders in a dance hall in the heart of this "City of Churches."

"Now that our own building has been secured, although it is a dedicated place, we have preferred to call it Crusade Hall rather than a Church so as to continue this witness, and that all people of all Churches may feel welcome to come and share in the revival that God has given to us," said Mr. Barrett.

Vision of Christ Necessary

Pastor Leo Harris then brought a message from Isaiah 6, pointing out that in the year King Uzziah died, Isaiah had a vision of the Lord high and lifted up and His glory filling the temple. Pastor Harris stressed the need for us to keep our eyes off human personalities, and to have a vision of Christ that this new building should always be filled with His power and glory. He showed how Isaiah's vision produced conviction, confession and cleansing, followed by the call of God, Isaiah's consecration and God's commission to him to preach to the people.

Pastor Harris emphasised the fact that, while we were grateful to God for this new building and for its beautiful appointments and facilities, we must believe for God's glory to fill the place in an even greater way than it did the hired halls in which we have worshipped in years past. God's glory is seen in His works of salvation, healing, deliverance and in transformed lives.

Blessings on Sunday Afternoon

Sunday afternoon, 7th June, about 260 people partook of Communion in a wonderful service in which the Spirit of God moved from beginning to end. Pastor Ken Chant spoke from Psalm 115, dwelling mainly on the first three verses, showing that all God's works are that His own Name might be glorified; and how we need to have a continued and increasing manifestation of God's power that the heathen should not be able to say, "Where is now their God?" In this service another ten people were received into the membership of the Adelaide Assembly.

Sunday Night Revival

Sunday evening the auditorium was comfortably filled with about 400 people (although seating can be arranged for over 100 more). Pastor Harris spoke on the theme, "When God Comes Down to Deliver," taking his message from Exodus, chapters 3 and 4. Three stepped forward for salvation and several testified to God's healing power in the prayer line that followed.

Came 250 Miles to be Healed

One man had travelled about 250 miles from Victoria for the expess purpose of being healed of several serious internal conditions requiring a major operation, having heard our radio programme in Victoria. As he was prayed for the pain left his body, and two nights later he returned to give glory to God because every symptom had left, and he knew God had wonderfully healed him.

We give praise to God for this first week-end in our new Crusade Hall, for the remarkable atmosphere in every meeting, and for the sheer joy of the people who are praising God for this new centre that He has given us in which to continue this ministry of miracles, signs and wonders in this City of Adelaide.

CROWDED GATHERINGS IN CRUSADE HALL

Revival Outpourings Follow Return of Leo Harris from Overseas

Great interest has been aroused by the return to Adelaide of Pastor Leo Harris from his nine-month visit to the United States and Canada. There have been splendid gatherings at the three main services each week—Sunday afternoon and evening and Tuesday evening.

Sunday nights, Crusade Hall has been crowded to capacity, and Tuesday nights over 400 have been in attendance. (Pictured below is one of the recent Sunday night congregations.) Each week, souls have turned to Christ as Saviour and, in the four weeks from Pastor Harris' return until the present writing, 24 have been baptized in the Holy Spirit with the Bible evidence of speaking in other tongues.

There has been special interest in Pastor Harris' reports of his experiences overseas and in his presentation of the New Testament pattern for the Christian Church. "We must have revival right in our local churches," he said. "This is the pattern of the New Testament and it is the answer to the spiritual problems both in America and in our own land."

This is the concept and vision of the Commonwealth Revival Crusade—the establishment of local churches according to the New Testament pattern, and for such local churches to have the fulness of the Holy Spirit's power in their midst.


What is the best part of being involved in a connect group?

ETC has been designed specifically with the development of congregational members of Adelaide Christian Centre (ACC) in mind. Its unique curriculum and desired outcomes are tailor made to fulfil the Biblical mandate as clearly stated in the book of Ephesians (4:11-12).

Course Overview

Candidates will be invited to enrol into either the 18-month Certificate in Christian Ministry and Theology course or the three





year Diploma in Christian Ministry and Leadership course.

Those who choose to enrol into the Certificate course only are encouraged to enrol for the additional 18 months Diploma course upon the completion of the Certificate level

Casual Students are those students who only decide to complete the theology units of the Certificate and Diploma Courses by correspondence.

Included in the Certificate course is a missions trip to a Pacific nation. This onfield experience will be for a period of 10 days and is a requirement to complete the World Missions unit.

Course study and classes will be conducted whilst on the missions trip. Note also that the costs of the missions trip are additional to the set course costs.

Affiliation and Accreditation

ETC is affiliated with and recognised as a Resource Training Centre of Vision International University (VIU).

ETC has intentionally decided not to go down the pathway of an Australian Accredited training course for the following reasons listed below.

- 1. We desire to include as many people as possible within the ACC community to be able to receive quality training at an affordable price. The cost of an accredited program with a Registered Training Organisation that offers accredited courses within Australia is out of reach for many of our people who wish to study and train.
- We desired the freedom and flexibility to choose the theological material and style of a program best suited for developing emerging leaders into ministry and leadership, whilst fulfilling the ACC vision, strategy and philosophy of ministry.
- We desire to align ETC with our other areas of influence and key partnerships across the international fields we work in. We also want to identify with the affiliation and accreditation they have with VIU, also known as Vision International Training and Education Network
- 4. We desire to continue to strengthen and to build upon our relationship with Dr Stan DeKoven and VIU for which he is the International President.

PROGRAMS

Meet and Greet Service

New migrants are met at Adelaide Airport and transported to their accommodation. We help them settle into their accommodation and provide information about essential tasks that need to be done on arrival.

New Arrivals Dinner

A special dinner which is run four times a year to welcome new migrants to South Australia. Qualified consultants are invited to speak on housing and accommodation, employment, and finance and banking.

Food and Fun Day

A fun-filled day that runs three times a year. The event includes a self-serve meal, social interaction through table tennis, bouncy castles and other activities. This is a great way for new migrants to build relationships with members of the community.

Speak, Hear, Speak

Speak, Hear, Speak is an English class that runs every Tuesday evening during the school term. These classes provide free conversational English lessons to new arrivals and others who consider English as their second language.

Practical Assistance

Adelaide City Care provides additional practical assistance to the disadvantaged members of the community including new arrivals to South Australia regardless of their age, sex, ethnic background, religion, political beliefs and marital status.

ABOUT US

A significant part of the mandate of our church is Christian Education. Leo Harris had a vision for Christian Education and plans were developed in 1976 and 1977 for a Christian School. Sunrise Christian School was founded in 1978 in Fullarton. A few years later Temple Christian College was founded as a sister organisation for high school students.

Adelaide Christian Schools (ACS) is an organisation that aims to oversee and support its schools ranging from Reception to Year 12 in co-educational settings and other training establishments. ACS is called to educate and train children in all aspects of life in such a way that God is seen to be the centre of everything - to be an extension of the Christian home, fulfilling the God-given mandate for parents to bring up their children in His ways.

The schools are governed by a Board with membership comprising individuals with vast experience and expertise from a variety of industry sectors. The Board works closely with Committees and Advisory Groups that have been established in each school community to engage with local leadership at a grass roots level, providing an opportunity for local input and expression.

OUR SCHOOLS

ACS governs and supports 11 schools. These schools comprise of approximately 2300 students and in excess of 250 staff. Each school offers its own distinctive qualities that focuses on the role of the family in education, character development and excellence in academics.

A HISTORY OF THE SCHOOLS

History of Sunrise Christian School

Sunrise Christian School Incorporated (SCS) is an incorporated body under the governance, oversight and spiritual covering of the Adelaide Crusade Centre Incorporated, trading as Adelaide Christian Centre (ACC), also known as Sturt Street.

As a result of a vision of the senior pastor at the Adelaide Crusade Centre, Mr. Leo Harris, Sunrise Christian School commenced. Ps Leo's vision was endorsed by the Elders, and a School Steering Committee was established in 1977 to put plans in place for a Bible- based Christian School. Ps Leo personally donated the first \$20 to start the school project. In 1978 Sunrise Christian School was birthed at the Fullarton Campus.

Fullarton Campus

SCS was founded in 1978 as a ministry of Adelaide Crusade Centre Inc (now Adelaide Christian Centre) in its premises Sunrise House in Wattle Street, Fullarton. It commenced with 32 students and two teachers and the support of a number of enthusiastic pioneer parents and supporters. Sunrise Christian School grew in its reputation for excellence in Biblebased Christian education, particularly in the areas of character development, which led to healthy waiting lists and very positive academic outcomes.

Paradise Campus

In 1989, at the request of Paradise

Assemblies of God Church, now Influencers Church, a new Campus was established on the property of the Church at Paradise. Paradise Assemblies of God (now Influencers Church) and Sunrise Christian School came to a point of agreement and started a school up on the Paradise Church land.

Morphett Vale Campus

In 1994 at the request of the Shekinah Church, now Gateway Community Church, another Campus was established on the property of the Church at Morphett Vale. In 2003 Sunrise purchased the property it occupies at Morphett Vale to the mutual benefit of both organisations.

Marion Campus

In 2002 Sunrise assumed responsibility for, and bought the property of Maranatha Christian School at Marion at the request of its School Board. This was the birth of its fourth campus. Since 2002 the numbers at the Campus have more than doubled. Not only did the purchase of the Campus swell the ranks of enrolments, administrative and teaching staff; it also introduced its own 8 – 12 programme replacing the existing ACE programme.

Until recently, the Marion Campus remained the only Sunrise Christian School to provide a middle and senior school option as a single stream high school. Modelled on the Sunrise credo of a family atmosphere, the high school placed a strong emphasises on developing Godly character and assisting each student to reach their potential.

Commencing 2019, following some

necessary legislative changes, the Sunrise Marion Campus will operate in partnership with Temple Christian College to provide students with the same SACE based curriculum and high school experience that has been experienced within its sister school for over 35 years at the Temple Christian College Mile End and Paralowie Campuses.

Naracoorte Campus

The fifth campus of Sunrise was added early 2005 when, at the request of the School Board, it assumed responsibility for Naracoorte Christian School in the South East of South Australia which became its first rural campus with 51 students. Since the adoption of the Naracoorte Campus, Sunrise has nearly doubled its numbers and therefore has needed to develop further classrooms in a short space of time. It wasn't long before the site was outgrown and the need to look for land was critical in order for future growth.

In 2009 we were blessed to be able to secure a new block of land in the local community. This was welcomed with much excitement. With expansive buildings plans now completed and fully operational at the new site, exciting plans are now in preparation for the expansion of a Sunrise Middle School enabling students to continue their educational journey from Year 7-10.

Whyalla Campus

Whyalla Christian School approached the ACS Board late in 2008 requesting assistance with the running of their school. After several negotiations it was agreed that the Whyalla Christian School would

become the Whyalla Sunrise Christian School Campus under the Governance of Adelaide Christian Schools adding a sixth school to the Sunrise group of schools. Following consistent an anticipated growth the Whyalla Campus is currently also preparing for the expansion into a Middle School offering for students in Year Levels 7 to 10

History of Temple Christian College

In 1983, a sister school, Temple Christian College also an incorporated body under the governance, oversight and spiritual covering of the Adelaide Crusade Centre was developed. Temple Christian College is a secondary school ranging from Grades 7-12. Initially Temple College shared the Unley Park facilities of the House of Tabor, now Tabor Adelaide, which itself had its roots in the Crusade Bible College, which was a department of ACC.

Temple went on to expand and eventually purchased the Hardy's Winery Buildings where it established its current Mile End Campus which is now home to over 450. students from all over Adelaide. In 2001 Temple opened its second Campus as a feeder school for Years 7-10, in close association with Bethany Christian School where it is co-located at Paralowie. Following strong and consistent growth, the Paralowie Campus now provides over 490 students with the compete Year 7 to 12 experience. Currently Temple Christian College has two Campuses - Mile End Campus Grade 7-12, and Paralowie Campus Grade 7-12 and is preparing to expand the Temple Christian College experience to Sunrise Christian School Marion Campus commencing 2019.

FAITH CHRISTIAN SCHOOL UPDATE

Faith Christian School is overseen by the Adelaide Christian Schools Board which provides accountability and support.

Since 1982, a quality education utilising Accelerated Christian Education curriculum has been offered. The school has achieved 'model and quality' status through ACE ministries. Students have a grade average of 88-100% while completing more than the required amount of work for the school year and therefore 'accelerating' through the curriculum.

In the following columns there is a report written by Jan Golding who recently went to Walhalla to help in the school.

The month of September saw the Principal of Faith Christian School in Walhalla, South Carolina USA, Miss Shaileigh Page, sustain a complex leg break after tripping over whilst teaching.

During this time a wonderful and committed band of volunteers stepped in to help supervise and support Mrs Johnson in the High School and Mrs Camie McCord in the Junior Primary School.

In response to Shaileigh's accident, Adelaide Christian Schools sent me across to Walhalla in the United States to support Shailelgh and the Faith Christian School students.

Leaving the familiarity of Sunrise Christian School here in Adelaide I ventured into a very different setting and education style in South Carolina.









Our 10 year old son Josiah also came with me and he was a wonderful help and encourager to the 38 students.

Josiah particularly enjoyed his times with Pr Warwick and Omega Hughes' boys, Jethro and Warwick Jr.

It was great to see that the Hughes family have settled into life in Walhalla so well.

Faith Christian School has grown and is building a sweet culture of Christ-centred and empowered education.

Community and parent support is developing and a faithful band of prayers love the school.

As in all new works there are many needs and wants. IT resources and extra support staff are being added as able.

In the short time I was there, two generous donations were realised. God provides and moves givers.

Local churches in the area are keen to share in chapel times and weekly devotions. They are enthusiastic about encouraging the young people in their spiritual walks.

Our prayer and support from Adelaide is highly valued in this mission work.

The school has such great potential to grow and see more schools realised.

We see the rich seeds of faith that have been sown into the heritage of Faith Center Church and Faith Christian School throughout the years.



Although we as a church were not directly involved in the construction of this new playground, Ps Mike has been heavily involved with the development of the Suva preschool building from the beginning. He

was involved in the development of the building plans and coordinated with others in running a charity golf day in Geelong each year to raise money for the project.

With this being the case, it is very special to see the new playground complete as it somewhat finalises the Suva preschool and compliments the building very nicely.

Building playgrounds in each of our preschools is part of goal one in our Fiji Preschools Development Project (more information can be found on pages 42-43). We will be releasing an update newsletter of the Fiji Preschools Development Project next month so stay tuned!

We are hoping that this playground will provide some inspiration and ideas for playgrounds in our other preschools. The large majority of our preschools do not currently have a playground or their









existing play equipment is in need of some serious maintenance and upgrades.

Throughout the month of November each of our preschools will be holding graduation ceremonies for their five year old students.

All of the children will dress up in their graduation gowns and receive their certificates in front of family and friends.

DOOR OF HOPE PRESCHOOL UPDATE

There are currently 16 children enrolled in the Door of Hope International Preschool which is located in Vavuniya in the Northern Province of Sri Lanka.

The preschool is located on a large property with two buildings. The first building is a large house that was originally built as an additional children's home. However, local government authorities decided that this could not be used as a children's home so it was changed into a preschool. This preschool has been running for several years now.

Up until the beginning of this year the front

of the large house held the preschool. Classes were held in the large open living area and one of the front bedrooms. The remainder of the house consisted of the preschool bathroom, rooms for storage and rooms for offices

All of the pictures above with the children and a teacher were taken in the original preschool building.

In the first few months of 2018 our preschool faced pressure from the local government who requested for the preschool to be relocated from the large house on the property to the second building.

If we did not comply with the local government's requests we faced the risk of the preschool closing down.

In order for us to successfully adhere to









these requests and to meet government regulations the new preschool building needed some considerable renovation work.

This renovation work is mostly complete with only a few touch ups needed here and there. The pictures above show the construction and renovation work that has been done to the new preschool building over the last couple of months. The first picture with the yellow building is what it looked like prior to the work beginning.

The original house on the property will continue to be used for the preschool offices, storage and some bathrooms. In the future preschool teachers and their families may also be accommodated in this house.

Over the next few months we are looking at

getting a quote for the extension of the roof on the original house so the roof runs further that the actual building. This will create more shelter and will protect the structure a bit more.

In addition to the renovation work that is being completed on the preschool building, maintenance and repair work has also been completed on the gate that leads into the preschool property.

In March 2019 Pr Mike, Kelly and Mikaela Groom, along with Neville and Jenni Peters, will travel to Sri Lanka and India. Whilst in Sri Lanka they will visit Bethel Children's Home and Door of Hope Preschool.

We would like to thank everyone who generously supports our children's homes and Door of Hope International Preschool in Sri Lanka.







SRI LANKA CHILDREN'S HOMES UPDATE

We have made some progress towards the goals set out in the Sri Lanka Displaced Children Development (more information on pages 42-43) and we have come up with some exciting developments that will be our focus over the next six months.


Over the next six months we will be focusing on developing the farm land for a rice field and a coconut plantation. Our previous farmer has left the farm due to some physical complications. We now have a new younger farmer with his family living on the farm. We will need to hire an additional farmer to look after the coconut plantation when that begins to develop.

The sewing school ran in August by the three ladies in our church was a huge success. A group of ladies will be heading to Sri Lanka this month from Stirling to run a follow-up sewing workshop. This will be another excellent opportunity for the children and it will allow them to put their new skills into practice. We will release a report of their trip in our next update newsletter for the project.

We currently have 13 boys and 19 girls in our care. A small number of children returned to their families this year and a few new children have entered the homes. We are fortunate enough to meet our financial obligations each month in regards to the ongoing care of staff and children.

Our boys' home warden and some of the boys have built a chicken coop on the boys' home property. They have purchased over 50 chickens and are running this as a







trial for what will later develop at the farm. This is an exciting initiative, one that was developed by the boys, and we are excited to see how the trial raising chickens goes.

One of our boys achieved straight As in all of his subjects this year except for in English in his ordinary level exams. This is great news! Our three older children, pictured above, who sat their final high school exams in August will receive their final results in December. Two of them are expecting fairly good results and the third is expecting a top result. The results for this third young man will determine what course he will study in university. He is looking at becoming an accountant.

All three of these older children have committed to teaching the other children English. Two of these older ones have left the home but they travel back to the children's homes from their villages most

days to hold these tutoring sessions. It is great to see them giving back to the children's homes.

We have enjoyed some great successes this year in the children's home but we have also faced some challenges. We still need to find a new cook for our boys' home. Our previous cook resigned and the current demand in salary for cooks is quite high.

In addition to this, the political climate in Sri Lanka is in chaos at the moment and democracy is in question. Please pray that any changes in the national government will not affect our children's homes and that we can continue on as normal.

Greetings to everyone from Faith Center Church here in Walhalla, South Carolina, United States of America (USA).

Praise God for this last month. October has been a great month for all of us here in Walhalla

One of the highlights for this month was that Omega and I celebrated 15 years of marriage.

I recently found out that October is pastor appreciation month here in the USA. On this day the Faith Center Church congregation showered us and Pr Kaye Hirst with words of appreciation and some small gifts.

Church attendance has been fluctuating between 10-29 people in our services this month.

Two new people came to church in October. One of these people used to come here some years ago. The other man came into the church, sat for a while and then left. He had been witnessed to and prayed with by one of our congregation members.

The wife of one of our congregation members has been having ankle problems. We have been visiting her regularly and have been holding a Friday morning prayer meeting in their home to encourage them. This has been really good.

Last week the wife was rushed to hospital as she was having problems breathing. It was discovered that she had blood clots







in her lungs. She is now recovering in hospital.

At the same time as all of this, the congregation member's brother passed away at 72 years of age.

Shaileigh Page, the principal of Faith Christian School here in Walhalla, gave a testimony to the church one Sunday morning about the miracle Jesus has done with her ankle.

Earlier this year Shaileigh significantly injured her ankle. The specialist told her that they were amazed at how perfect her bone has healed back together. We all know this is the work of our Father God. Amen.

We have had a number of prayer requests come in for different people, some from

outside the church here, for healing or prayer covering before they have an operation.

One recent Sunday I preached on healing. We had about four people respond for prayer. As we finished praying one of our congregation members said they had just received a text asking if we could pray for a man that had been admitted to the hospital. Praise God that people are texting in their prayer needs during our services.

We visited an older couple on the property. Omega and I had a great time with them. They have interesting stories to tell of their mission trips and times at Faith Training Center.

Some of the men in our church went to a Catalyst Meeting for men at a Baptist church. About 30 men from other churches









also attended the meeting. The meeting was to encourage Christian men to mentor younger men in the principles of God. It is called Radical Mentoring.

For the last three months he has been out in Gaire village, about two hours south east of Port Moresby. He also spent three weeks in Bialla, in the West New Britain Province, working under the pastors there as part of furthering his ministry experience and exposure. He has been preaching, visiting homes and surrounding villages, taking R.I, ministering amongst the youth, working in the gardens and other physical work, as well as children's ministry.









BETHEL INTERNATIONAL TRAINING COLLEGE

Bethel International Training College (BITC) is the registered training facilitator for all training programs in Bethel Christian Centre (BCC). BITC is located at the BCC property in Port Moresby, National Capital District, Papua New Guinea (PNG). An outline of the courses offered by BITC follows.

Bethel Bible School (BBS): 1974 - 2018

The first and the oldest school (formerly Crusade Bible School) started in 1974 and is now in its 45th year. It serves to train Christian men and women across all

denominations and walks of life, who love the Lord Jesus and desire to study His Word. This year in 2018 we have 14 first year students and 10 second year students. Ps Billy Vaname is the Dean of Students with three support staff assisting him

Frontier Evangelism Institute (FEI): 1981 - 2018

Formerly known as PNG Institute of Evangelism (PNGIE), FEI is a six month course designed to prepare and equip men and women to be effective in frontier ministry, evangelism, church planting and pioneering. It has been the catalyst in planting churches in the pioneering days. There are ten students in the 2018 intake from five different provinces in PNG. Judah Wesley is the Coordinator overseeing the program with three other staff.

Bethel Bible College (BBC): 1984 - 2018

BBC is a two year live in program with the first year understudying the World Missions Faith Training School Curriculum. This fulltime Ministry Training College provides a unique opportunity for specialised study and preparation for ministry. Students come from many countries to participate. The unique environment of cross cultural relationships provides an ideal setting for an active discipleship school. This year in 2018 there are 13 Diploma students with the inclusion of one student from the Solomon Islands Ps. Abel Manzanilla is the Principal, assisted by the Dean of Students and a staff who oversee this training program. An additional four staff manage the students' kitchen.

Bethel Women's School of Ministry (BWSOM): 1993 - 2018

This course was started to meet the needs of women in all spheres of life. It aims to ground women deeply in the Word of God for effective ministry, to handle difficulties encountered and to make appropriate application of the Word of God in their personal, family and everyday lives. It is open to ladies (single and married) from all denominations. There are eight women in the 2018 class. Mrs Rhoda Hageyo is the Coordinator of BWSOM with two female single staff assisting her.

World Missions Faith Training School (WMFTS): 1999 - 2018

To educate and train those who have a desire to become missionaries and/or who want to promote and support missions in the local church. This vision was given by God to Ps Barry Silverback, International Missions


Director of CRC Churches International, who is also the Principal of WMFTS. This school offers direction and purpose to those who desire to see missions take a more prominent place within their own lives and the life of their church. The 2018 intake has 19 students with the inclusion of one student each from Fiji, Tonga and the Philippines. Rachelle Hardy is the Deputy Principal with four permanent staff assisting in monitoring its daily activities, together with two missionaries currently on exposure program.

Bethel Pre-School Teacher Training (BPSTT): 2019

Preparations are underway to see the BPSTT commence in BCC in early 2019. The construction of the new classroom is commencing this month. Sister Viema Vakacegu, a Fijian missionary, who is a qualified preschool teacher will head up this program with the assistance of a national staff. There is already a lineup of applicants from PNG, Ghana, and Vanuatu with other nations open for entry.

Global Trainers Conference (GTC): Since 1994

Formerly known as PNG CRC Principals/
Trainers Conference. GTC facilitates
the gathering of Provincial Bible School
Principals and the Lead Pastor of the
Hosting Local Church in the Province.
GTC fosters friendship and reunion. The
GTConference is an avenue for sharing
of ideas, identifying strengths and
weakness, encouragement and monitoring
of curriculum. Ps Gwaibo Badira is the
facilitator of GTC along with the Hosting
Provincial Bible Principal.



TENNANT CREEK TRIP REPORT

Pr Barry and I recently travelled to Tennant Creek, 500kms north of Alice Springs. I had made contact with a local pastor there who is leading a church that is predominately made up of Indigenous Australians.

As a leadership team we felt in the Lord about two years ago to support an Indigenous ministry. We commenced putting aside \$200 per month as a step of faith in believing the Lord would direct to a ministry that he would have us as a church to support.

Up until recently, nothing really presented itself as a reliable nor viable option for us to support. After making contact with Pr Mike Baker in Tennant Creek, I felt it would be

best for Pr Barry and I to go and visit to get a feel of what their church are doing in regards to reaching and ministering to Indigenous Australians.

Interestingly, the church has a few Papuan New Guineans who have relocated to Tennant Creek to help Pr Mike and his team

After our visit, we see possibilities as a church to send a ministry team into Tennant Creek mid-way through next year to do evangelism amongst the children and the Indigenous camps around Tennant Creek. Also, we may look into running a mini bible school for a week, focusing on Christian foundations and our identity in Christ among other things.

We may also work alongside Pr Barry in potentially sending in a couple of Papuan New Guineans to stay with the church for a









two to three months ministry trip.

We are in the exploring stage and we will continue to communicate with Pr Mike and his team to hopefully plan some of the above mentioned for next year. I will keep you all informed of any developments and decisions.

It is interesting to note that Pr Mike and his wife Lorraine have had connections with our church in the early days and the CRC Church in Port Augusta and Alice Springs. See below for some of their journey.

Mike and Lorraine's involvement with Adelaide Christian Centre (ACC)

Pr Mike began attended ACC in 1966 and Lorraine began attending in 1968. They attended Sunrise Bible School at Sunrise House from 1969-70 and were married in 1970. They moved to Port Augusta in December 1970.

In 1976 they moved to Alice Springs and attended a CRC church there. Pr Basil Porter was the pastor at the time.

They then moved to Tennant Creek in 1982. They began attending the Assemblies of God church there and in 1999 Mike became the Senior Pastor, where he is still the Senior Pastor.

The church is made up of mostly Indigenous Australians with a number of Africans mixed in. They run two services on a Sunday.

The church has an extensive outreach ministry not only in Tennant Creek but in many communities in the Barkly region where approximately 8,000 people reside.
