

1st July 2019 - 30th June 2020

Over the last few years we have focused on upgrading various parts of our church facility.

We have moved our church offices to 33 Sturt Street. We have upgraded the upstairs area to create space for our children and youth. We have upgraded the crèche and installed an indoor playground. We have replaced all the carpet in the foyer and other areas downstairs, as well as painted the walls.

Our Facility Upgrade Project carries on with our desire to improve our church facility. Please read ahead for more information.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The first phase of our Facility Upgrade Project is complete. This includes the refurbishments that were done to the auditorium (painting and carpet) and the signs that have been installed inside and outside the building.

We are nearing completion of phase two of the project which consists of constructing the facilities listed below

- 1. Accessible toilet and shower
- 2. First aid room
- 3. Lobby entrance into both areas

We are excited about these developments and we believe they will be of great benefit to our church family and all guests who experience our facility.

PROGRAMS

Meet and Greet Service

New migrants are met at Adelaide Airport and transported to their accommodation. We help them settle into their accommodation and provide information about essential tasks that need to be done on arrival.

New Arrivals Dinner

A special dinner which is run four times a year to welcome new migrants to South Australia. Qualified consultants are invited to speak on housing and accommodation, employment, and finance and banking.

Food and Fun Day

A fun-filled day that runs three times a year. The event includes a self-serve meal, social interaction through table tennis, bouncy castles and other activities. This is a great way for new migrants to build relationships with members of the community.

Speak, Hear, Speak

Speak, Hear, Speak is an English class that runs every Tuesday evening during the school term. These classes provide free conversational English lessons to new arrivals and others who consider English as their second language.

Practical Assistance

Adelaide City Care provides additional practical assistance to the disadvantaged members of the community including new arrivals to South Australia regardless of their age, sex, ethnic background, religion, political beliefs and marital status.

A significant part of the mandate of our church is Christian Education. Leo Harris had a vision for Christian Education and plans were developed in 1976 and 1977 for a Christian School. Sunrise Christian School was founded in 1978 in Fullarton. A few years later Temple Christian College was founded as a sister organisation for high school students.

Adelaide Christian Schools (ACS) is an organisation that aims to oversee and support its schools ranging from Reception to Year 12 in co-educational settings and other training establishments. ACS is called to educate and train children in all aspects of life in such a way that God is seen to be the centre of everything - to be an extension of the Christian home, fulfilling the God-given mandate for parents to bring up their children in His ways.

The schools are governed by a Board with membership comprising individuals with vast experience and expertise from a variety of industry sectors. The Board works closely with Committees and Advisory Groups that have been established in each school community to engage with local leadership at a grass roots level, providing an opportunity for local input and expression.

HELPING THE NEEDY















Bethel Children's Homes

Sri Lanka: \$400 per month
Tax Deductible Project Code: J982N

Bethel Children's Homes have been in operation since 1998 when the first home opened with 11 girls. Since then two new homes have been built to house more girls on the same property. A property was also purchased to build a new home for boys. All of the children in the homes have been affected in some way by the war and civil unrest in Sri Lanka. This has resulted in them being displaced, physiologically affected and discriminated against.

The homes have government permission to care for up to 40 children. They maintain a family-like environment by ensuring a high level of individual care. The homes ensure all children are sent to primary and secondary schools within the community,

assures all medical and healthcare needs are met, provides all subsistence needs (i.e. food, clothing, shelter, water, sanitation, recreation etc.), and commits to continually support their overall physical, emotional, mental and intellectual development.

Our church provides financial and management support for the children and staff within the homes. As a church we sponsor four children - Angel, Sharon, Jonathan and George.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that all new children who come into the home will settle in
- Pray for our dedicated staff who take care of the children day-to-day
- Pray for safety following the Easter Sunday bombings in Sri Lanka

Children's Feeding Programs Philippines: \$100 per month

Thousands of children have been ministered to throughout the Philippines by our feeding programs. Our children's feeding programs use strict attendance and monitoring records and are run for children in three age groups – 3 to 6 year olds (Level 1), 7 to 10 year olds (Level 2) and 11 to 14 year olds (Level 3).

Multiple activities are included within the feeding programs – feeding, Bible teaching, Gospel preaching, prayers for the children and their families, prayers for the communities, world missions orientation, games, memory verses, praise and worship, and assignments on the Bible. These programs may also go further to include children camps, family visits and Christmas gift giving.

CRC children's feeding programs differ from other feeding programs in the Philippines. They do not simply seek to provide food to children to fill their stomachs on a short term basis. They aim to provide education on nutrition and to provide nutritious meals so the health of children and their families may improve long term.

SRI LANKA RELIEF PROJECT: REBUILDING BATTICALOA

On Easter Sunday 2019 explosions went off in multiple churches and hotels across Sri Lanka. Five attacks were carried out around the capital city of Colombo. One bombing occurred in Batticaloa in the Eastern Province of Sri Lanka.

More than 250 people lost their lives as a result of these Easter Sunday attacks and hundreds more were injured. Many people have been left with lifelong disabilities and injuries.

The nation remains in an uncertain and

fragile state as reports of potential additional explosions continue to surface.

One of the churches that was targeted during the bombings was Zion Church in Batticaloa. The church building, accommodation block, pastor's house, lecture rooms and the church bookshop were all badly damaged by the blast and are in desperate need of repair.

As of Wednesday the 1st of May, it is confirmed that 30 people in the church have lost their lives and a number of people remain in hospital, some are still in a critical condition. Numerous people have been left with lifelong injuries, such as blindness and loss of limbs.

Many of the deaths from this attack were children who had just finished Sunday School and were waiting at the entrance

of the church for their parents so they could head into the Easter Sunday Service together.

Working in partnership with Global Development Group (GDG), the Sri Lanka Relief Project: Rebuilding Batticaloa, is supporting the rebuilding and repair of the church facilities that were damaged.

People from Australia, New Zealand and the United States of America who give towards the project are eligible to receive tax deductible benefits. Anybody who does not require tax deductibility can still give through the project.

A fundraising page has been set up for the project through Raisely. A goal of \$50,000 has been set for the project. Please refer to the details in the following column if you are looking to make a donation.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

MESSAGE FROM THE CRC'S INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS DIRECTOR

Around 1986 Bethel Christian Centre in Port Moresby, PNG decided to try and do something for people from developing countries who did not have the opportunity or access to study or training in Christian ministry and service for the Lord. Bethel began ISSP as part of Bethel World Missions in response to this need.

ISSP allows us to recruit people from nations where the Bethel World Missions

arm has pioneered CRC ministries. We do not focus on people just from CRC churches, but also those from non-CRC ministries that we either partner with or have some relationship with.

In practical terms, this program involves us fully sponsoring students for their medicals, passports, visas, international and domestic airfares, accommodation, and all tuition fees to bring them from their nations to study and be trained at Bethel Bible College, and at a later stage, the World Missions Faith Training School.

Students come for a period of two years. They have the option of a third year of practical field ministry exposure, working alongside Bethel pastors and staff or in one of our other CRC churches in a different province within PNG. Most students return back to their home nation and either

work in CRC ministries or in their own denominations from which they originally came from. Some selected graduates stay for a fourth year and became part of the Bethel Christian Centre staff, working in various ministry departments.

Our earliest students came some time before 1987. From 1987 onwards a good number of students began coming to PNG under ISSP. Since the program began until now, we have seen students come from India, the Philippines, Fiji, Indonesia, the Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, Ghana, Tonga, Vanuatu, Australia and New Zealand.

Some of our previous students have become missionaries in other countries outside of their own nations.

In 2019 we have one young lady from Ghana and another from Vanuatu who are enrolled in our new Preschool Teacher Training Course. They are sponsored by Bethel under ISSP. When they complete their studies they will return to their nations and take up full-time teaching positions in preschools and primary schools.

When we give an opportunity to an individual who would otherwise not have had any hope of training and developing their desire to serve God, we are investing in their lives by empowering them to be the person God designed them to be and to do the things that will benefit His Kingdom.

To give young men and women an opportunity to grow, develop and be inspired to be all that God has for them to do is such a worthy cause. I do not know of any greater reward than investing in the

future of people's lives, and seeing the ongoing investment producing results into the future well beyond ourselves.

To actually see young people become true men and women of God, serving with passion and purpose is such an amazing sight.

Comparing it with our minuscule time and effort given to mentoring, training and growing their lives is truly what I call 'the gold' in life. This is more valuable than position, power, praise and possessions.

People's lives that have been transformed and positioned for God and His kingdom is the real gold in a minister's life. It is a specific joy to have been part of their journey in Christ and that joy continues as we see them walk in partnership with him.

The majority of those trained through ISSP have gone on to Christian service in their churches and a majority are now pastors and ministers of the Gospel in their own right.

In my view ISSP must continue for many years to come. It is a wonderful way that individuals and churches can significantly invest in the future of someone's life.

I am deeply moved with this thought and theme – 'Sow a seed and change a life'. ISSP is an avenue that sows seeds through the training and mentoring program that it provides.

What an amazing privilege it is to be a partner with God in this kind of program.
