lead by example.

1 Thessalonians 2:11-12

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her. **Ephesians 5:26**

Yet, it is about how we treat everyone. How do we treat the poor, enemies, those who differ with us, or oppose us? (love your enemies).

Do we take interest in those who are 'different' or can do nothing for us?

How do we talk <u>about</u> people? How do we talk <u>to</u> people?

How we treat women and girls and talk about them is so critical.

We are to use our power and strength to serve.

Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives and treat them with respect as the (physically) weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will hinder your prayers 1 Peter 3:7 (parenthesis mine).

Boys desperately need to see this.

I am watching your character; the choices you are making.

Honesty, integrity, courage - even when it is tempting not to.

Pay close attention to your life and to your teaching. Persevere in these things, for by so doing you will save both yourself and those who hear you. 1 Timothy 4:16

I am watching how you handle fear, failure, and struggle.

I came to you in [a state of] weakness and fear and great trembling. I Corinthians 2:3 AMP

Appropriate sharing of weakness, struggle, admitting failure, saying sorry, model **humility** (wisdom is needed about when and how much to share).

We help our children when we also model perseverance, <u>courage</u>, resilience, and problem solving.

We help them to embrace the truth that mistakes, and failure, are part of the journey of growth.

Dependency upon God in prayer and faith deeply impact children

Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance.

Romans 5:3

But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead. 2 Corinthians 9:1b

I am watching how you conduct your relationship with God; how you follow Christ.

And you should imitate me, just as I imitate Christ. 1 Corinthians 11:1 said Paul.

Jesus' example is enough! If we model our lives on Him, we will be the ideal father. Why? When we see Jesus, we see the Father in action.

Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? **John 14:9**

Fathers, our little ones need us to show them the way to live. They are watching us!
