#### **JESUS AND THE WORD**

#### Jesus was the Word.

John 1:1 (niv) In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

- The Word tabernacled / dwelt among us.

John 1:14 (amp) And the Word (Christ) became flesh (human, incarnate) and tabernacled (fixed His tent of flesh, lived awhile) among us; and we [actually] saw His glory (His honor, His majesty), such glory as an only begotten son receives from his father, full of grace (favor, loving-kindness) and truth.

### Jesus spoke the words the Father gave to Him say.

John 14:24-26 (nlt) Anyone who doesn't love me will not obey me. And remember, my words are not my own. What I am telling you is from the Father who sent me. 25: I am telling you these things now while I am still with you. 26: When the Father sends the Advocate as my representative that is, the Holy Spirit - He will teach you everything and will remind you of everything I have told you.

### Jesus' personal recommendation regarding the Word of God for our lives.

- The Word of God is our bread.
- We are to live by feeding on the Word of God.
- The Word gives us nourishment and strength.

Matthew 4:4 (amp) He replied, it has been written, Man shall not live and be upheld and sustained by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.

#### Jesus KNEW the Scriptures.

 He constantly pointed people to the Word of God as a sure foundation for building a good life, a marriage and establishing right living.

#### Jesus' USE of the Word.

- He used the Scriptures as a source of comfort, encouragement and direction when giving council and advice to people who were facing challenges and troubling situations.
- Jesus intertwined the Scriptures into parables to teach the people poignant lessons.
- Jesus' ability to teach the Word so people could understand it came from His familiarity with the Scriptures - from a heart that had been touched and affected by the Word itself.

Matthew 7:28-29 (niv) When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were amazed at his teaching, 29: because he taught as one who had authority, and not as their teachers of the law.

Luke 4:36 (niv) All the people were amazed and said to each other, "What is this teaching? With authority and power He gives orders to evil spirits and they come out!"

### Jesus was very familiar with what the Scriptures said about Himself.

 He knew who He was and His purpose and mission on earth - for the benefit of mankind.

### We also need to know what God's Word says about us - our identity in Christ.

- To know our mission/purpose for which we are saved (*to serve*) and to serve others.

Luke 24:25-27 (niv) He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! 26: Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" 27: And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

## The words Jesus spoke were not His own. They came directly from His heavenly Father.

John 12:48-50 (amp) Anyone who rejects Me and persistently sets Me at naught, refusing to accept My teachings, has his judge [however]; for the [very] message that I have spoken will itself judge and convict him at the last day. 49: This is because I have never spoken on My own authority or of My own accord or as self-appointed, but the Father Who sent Me has Himself given Me orders [concerning] what to say and what to tell. 50: And I know that His commandment is (means) eternal life. So whatever

I speak, I am saying [exactly] what My Father has told Me to say and in accordance with His instructions.

#### I will put My words in His mouth.

**Deuteronomy 18:18-19** I will raise up for them a Prophet from among their brethren like you, and will put My words in his mouth; and he shall speak to them all that I command him. **19:** And whoever will not hearken to My words which he shall speak in My name, I Myself will require it of him.

# Believers have been given God's Word and are accountable as to how they respond to that Word.

John 17:6 (nkjv) "I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word.

John 17:14 (nkjv) I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world.

### Jesus' relationship to the believer is through His Word.

John 15:7 (nkjv) If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you.

(phillips) But if you live your life in me, and my words live in your hearts, you can ask for whatever you like and it

will come true for you. This is how my Father will be glorified - in your becoming fruitful and being my disciples.

### A true disciple is one who continues to follow and obey the teaching of Jesus.

John 8:31 (amp) So Jesus said to those Jews who had believed in Him, If you abide in My word [hold fast to My teachings and live in accordance with them], you are truly My disciples.

# The Word of God has the ability to inflame our hearts with emotive feelings of wellbeing, enthusiasm, passion and purpose.

Luke 24:32 (kjv) And they said one to another, Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures?

- This same kind of relationship to the Word is something that we also need to consider embracing for our own lives.
- Where the Word of God is our default position we resort to for guidance, comfort and inspiration for our lives.
- Also, in our efforts to help / counseling people through their struggles and difficulties etc.

The Word is rendered powerless because of our traditions.

Mark 7:13 (niv) Thus you nullify the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And you do many things like that.

## Hearing His word comes from an attitude of willingness to learn.

John 8:43 (nkjv) Why do you not understand My speech? Because you are not able to listen to My word.

## Our future status is to be determined by Jesus' words and teachings.

John 12:48 (darby) He that rejects me and does not receive my words, has him who judges him: the word which I have spoken, that shall judge him in the last day.

- Jesus handled the hate that people had for Him by the consolation of the Word that had been written about Him - "the prophetic word."
- He referred His current situation of people hating Him, with what was previously written about Him in the Word - written in the law
- He faced life's challenges and dealt with them by what God had previously written about Him.
- This reveals Jesus' relationship to the Word and the Word to Jesus.
- He was connected to the Word and what had been written about Him. Which was His comfort and strength.

John 15:25 (darby) But that the word written in their law might be fulfilled, they hated me without a cause.

### Studying the Scriptures does not give salvation or give eternal life.

John 5:39-40 (net) You study the scriptures thoroughly because you think in them you possess eternal life, and it is these same scriptures that testify about me, 40: but you are not willing to come to me so that you may have life.

John 8:37 (net) I know that you are Abraham's descendants. But you want to kill me, because my teaching makes no progress among you.
