

GOD IS MORE THAN ENOUGH

Main Text:

“My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness.” 2 Corinthians 12:9

Supporting Texts:

Psalm 23:1; Philippians 4:11–13; John 6:1–13

Key discovery:

In my weakness, God is more than enough.

“The Lord is my Shepherd; I lack nothing.” Psalm 23:1

Aim:

To help us recognise that in every area of life – in weakness, in needs, and in the future –
CHRIST IS ALL-SUFFICIENT

Question:

Have you ever come to a point in life where you felt completely weak, empty, or not enough – yet somehow discovered that God’s strength carried you through?

“There is no pit so deep, that God’s grace is not deeper still.” Corrie Ten Boom

God's Grace Is Enough in Our Weakness

- Paul's thorn: not removed, but supplied with grace
- God doesn't say, "*You are strong enough*" – He says, "*I am strong enough.*"
- That's why Paul could say, "*I will boast all the more gladly about my weakness, so that Christ's power may rest on me.*" (2 Corinthians 12:9)
- Illustrations:
 - **Gideon** (Judges 6–7) – Too weak, yet God gave victory with 300 men
 - **Moses** (Exodus 4) – Slow of speech, yet God gave him words
 - **Elijah** (1 Kings 19) – Afraid and weary, yet God met him in whisper
- Our weakness is the stage for God's strength.

God Is More Than Enough for Our Needs

- Psalm 23:1 says, "*The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want.*"
- God cares in turbulence, in restlessness, in weariness, in danger, in the presence of our enemies and in everyday life.
- Illustrations:

- **Manna in the wilderness** (Exodus 16) – daily provision
 - **Widow of Zarephath** (1 Kings 17) – oil and flour sustained
 - **Ravens feeding Elijah** (1 Kings 17:2–6) – unlikely provision
- If God is enough, we stop focusing on what we lack and start focusing on Who we have.

God Is More Than Enough in Our Lack

- John 6:1–13 – **Feeding of the 5,000**: Jesus multiplies “not enough”.
- Philip said there wasn’t enough. Andrew brought a small lunch – **5 loaves and 2 fish**.
- But in Jesus’s hands, it multiplied into more than enough.
- Whatever feels small in our life, let’s surrender it to Him.

God Is More Than Enough in Any Season

- Philippians 4:11–13 – Paul learned contentment in all circumstances.
- Illustrations:
 - **Joseph** (Genesis 39–41) – pit, prison, palace

- **Daniel** (Daniel 6) – in the lions’ den
- **Paul & Silas** (Acts 16) – worshipping in chains
- Personal story: Petrol station encounter – learning peace in small frustrations.
- From delays to disasters, He is still enough.

Closing Challenge:

- Are we lacking provision, peace, direction, strength?
- Truth: God Is More Than Enough – El Shaddai, the All-Sufficient One
 - Jesus did not just give bread – **He is the Bread of Life.**
 - Jesus doesn’t just provide peace – **He is our Peace.**
 - Jesus doesn’t just show the way – **He is the Way.**

Our Response:

- If the Lord is more than enough, then our response is to:
 - Rest in His provision.
 - Rely on His strength.

- Surrender our “not enough”.

How do we practically outwork this:

- Start our day with God’s Word.
- Pray before decisions.
- Build rhythms of prayer.
- Surrender in crisis.
- Let daily frustrations remind us: God is enough.

Conclusion:

- Going back to the first question, *“Have you ever faced a “not enough”?*
- You’re not alone. Because this truth is not just a sermon title – it’s a promise: **GOD IS MORE THAN ENOUGH.**
 - His grace is enough in our weaknesses.
 - His provision is enough in our lack.
 - His strength is enough in our weariness.
- God is not just enough to get us by – **He is more than enough** to carry us and cause us to overflow.
- Will you place your “not enough” in His hands today?
